Tour Financial Obligation Reminder and Trip Insurance

As you know, we are now well underway with our Paris tour project. It promises to be a fabulous musical and cultural experience! In order to make this the ultimate reality. all tour members have a financial obligation. All payments are to be made as specified and on time and are nonrefundable, even if you end up not going on tour. As a reminder, since the contract signing with our main tour vendor, ACFEA, in May of 2013, all tour members are responsible for the entire cost of the tour. This is why we have repeatedly urged all tour members to obtain **some type** of trip cancellation There are many different insurance. types available through many vendors, including your own insurance agent, AAA and possibly AARP as well as the Travel Guard Insurance example sent out to all tour members in June. Maestro Richard Coffey, our Musical Leader

(who is he?)

Richard Coffey, Music Director of the Hartford Chorale, is one of New England's principal choral conductors. He served as interim Music Director of the Hartford Chorale in the 2005-2006 season which led to his appointment as the permanent Music Director of the Chorale in June of 2006. Dedicated to music what appears to be 24/7, he is also the founding Music Director of CONCORA, Connecticut Choral Artists, professional vocal ensemble. Organist and Minister of Music of the South Church of New Britain, where he conducts a choir of professional and amateur singers and serves as Artistic Director of its Music Series, which annually presents concerts by visiting artists.



Coffey holds degrees in music from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro and the School of Sacred Music of New York's Union Theological Seminary.

So what is he really like? (And why do we love him so?) He's a Southern

Gentleman. Honestly, he's perfectionist. He worries about everything – details that wouldn't ruffle most are on his list. The very serious and dedicated Mr. Coffey rehearsals promptly, takes warming up as seriously as any phrase in Mozart, sees who sneaks in late from the corner of his eye, can hear a sour note or a rest with sound (oops - rests don't have sound - who did that!!) and know exactly who sang it from 200 paces. Rick has made the Hartford Chorale love and appreciate slapping their thighs and stomping their feet to even the most serious sacred or secular piece. And somewhere, in the midst of all that seriousness, his eyes will warm with a story which will often break all that seriousness apart in bits and fits of laughter just for a moment, and then 180 voices get back to their focused intent. That focused intent is why we On Monday nights before are there. rehearsal there is a long line of choristers at the local Starbucks. We power up with a grande blast - to be on the edge of our seats, and on top of our voices for Maestro Coffey.

Close to the Moulin Rouge, the Basilique du Sacre Coeur, and the Haussman-Opéra district's stores, the Mercure Paris Montmartre Sacré Coeur hotel offers spacious and modern rooms. It is said to be perfect for business travel or romantic weekends in Paris and the hotel is within easy reach of the Gare du Nord station, St Lazare train station, and the metro which make main tourist attractions, such as the Eiffel Tower, and Champs Elysées easily accessible.

A Possible Tour Extension!

The tour committee has been working hard to identify a three day, three night extension to the Paris Tour. Right now it is looking like a trip to the Loire Valley would be a lot of fun.

Included would be coach transportation to Saumur, a bi-lingual courier to accompany us, three nights hotel accommodation, Breakfasts, one dinner, Wine tastings in the famous caves, entrance fee and guided tour of it's famous 14th-century chateau, the Chateau Aizay le Rideau, some free

afternoons for individual exploring and wine tastings and coach transportation back to the Paris airport for departure to the USA. It is expected to cost in the neighborhood of \$700 (USD), if we have enough interested travelers.

This would also be available to those making their own international air arrangements! You would just plan your return trip home on Friday, July 11, 2014 instead of Tuesday, July 8, 2014
